EXHIBIT "A"

17.08-3 Financial Assurance

(a) Purpose

P&D may require the applicant to submit a financial assurance to ensure compliance with the approved erosion control plans, stormwater management plans, other stormwater permit requirements, and as-built submittals unless the Town in which the subject lands are located has required a financial assurance to ensure compliance with the same requirements.

(b) Type and Authority

P&D shall <u>determine the acceptable type and form of financial assurance, which</u> <u>may include cash, or a bond or accept</u> an irrevocable letter of credit <u>enly</u> from an approved financial institution with Kenosha County, Wisconsin named as the beneficiary and upon written notice to the permit holder, be authorized to use the funds to complete activities required in the approved plans or this ordinance if the permit holder or other responsible party defaults or does not properly implement the requirements.

17.09-3 Stormwater Management Performance Standards

All stormwater management plans and associated BMPs shall meet the following minimum requirements to the maximum extent practicable. Runoff draining to a stormwater BMP from off-site must be accounted for hydraulically in any BMP design. It is highly recommended that the applicant meet with P&D prior to preparing a stormwater management plan to determine the applicability of these requirements early in the site planning process.

(a) Peak Discharge

Minimum Requirement

To minimize downstream bank erosion and the failure of downstream conveyance systems, the peak stormwater discharge rate **shall not exceed** the rates as described below. Modeling requirements for this provision are further described Section II.F.

a. Reduce the post-development peak rates of runoff during the one-, two-, 10-, and 100-year recurrence interval storms to less than the peak rates of runoff during the same recurrence interval storms occurring under predevelopment conditions for the Towns of Brighton, Paris, Randall, Salem, and Wheatland.

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department has entered into an agreement with Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WI DOT) to provide additional traffic control assistance, speed enforcement and incident response services, related to I-94 NS corridor construction. Services provided by KSD will allow for quicker first responses to crashes on key alternate routes, quicker incident removals, and added presence at sensitive facilities such as in school zones and parks during the freeway construction project beginning July 1, 2018 and ending December 31, 2019, and

WHEREAS, these additional services will be approximately 1200 working hours on an as needed basis and may occur during any of the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department deputy work shifts. Kenosha County Sheriff's Department will charge the WI DOT for the actual deputy hours worked and attributable to the work performed under the agreement, and

WHEREAS, the WI DOT will provide the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department reimbursable funding for these functions in the amount up to \$50,000, and

WHEREAS, total reimbursement to the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department for traffic mitigation measures will not exceed \$50,000, and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department will submit a quarterly bill to the WI DOT, containing a statement of expenses supported by a description of items and/or services provided, and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department would like to recognize \$20,000 of this revenue source in 2018 and include the allowance for 2019 in the operating budget as part of the annual budget preparation process.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors accept the 2018 adjustments of \$20,000 to the revenue budget for the Sheriff's Department as detailed in the attached budget modification form, which is incorporated herein by reference.

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AGREEMENT BETWEEN

THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE KENOSHA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

State Project I.D. 1320-25-93 CONTRACT NO. 01 2018-2019 Transportation Management Plan I-94 NS Corridor Construction

This agreement is a formal partnership, made and entered into between the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DEPARTMENT) and the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department (COUNTY), to provide for services as described herein. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation and Kenosha County Sheriff's Department are partnering during the I-94 N-S Freeway Project (PROJECT) to ensure that emergency response capabilities are not adversely affected by roadway reconstruction.

The DEPARTMENT advises implementation of a comprehensive and cost effective transportation management plan that will help ensure the safety, accessibility and mobility for the traveling public in the PROJECT area. The PROJECT area is defined as interstate I-94 from Racine and Milwaukee County Line on the north side to Highway 142 on the south side. Included in the PROJECT area are local alternate routes within five miles of the interstate roadways.

To mitigate traffic impacts caused by the PROJECT, the DEPARTMENT will provide \$50,000 to the COUNTY. In turn, the COUNTY will provide planning, coordination and staffing services (as outlined below) in an effort to mitigate emergency incidents in the PROJECT area and stay informed of PROJECT roadway closures and construction progress for a 1½ year period commencing on July 1, 2018 and ending on December 31, 2019.

The monies provided by this agreement will allow for COUNTY to assist in:

- Traffic control assistance during changing traffic patterns and freeway closures
- Speed enforcement on alternate routes, school zones, and other local roads
- Clearing minor debris that is disruptive to traffic flow
- Evaluation of emergency access and traffic control plans
- Assist in development of an Incident Crisis Communications Plan
- Participation in incident "dry run" exercises

Enforcement Enhancements

The COUNTY shall provide additional enforcement on key alternate routes related to I-94 NS Corridor Construction to keep alternate routes open and traffic moving. These enhancement services will allow for quicker first responses to crashes on key alternate routes, quicker incident removals, and added presence at sensitive facilities (schools, parks, etc.). The COUNTY shall

also attend I-94 NS Corridor related construction progress meetings and coordinate closure schedules when necessary.

Basis of Payment

The COUNTY shall charge for the actual hours worked and attributable to the work performed and described above under this agreement to the DEPARTMENT. The DEPARTMENT will provide to the COUNTY reimbursable funding for these functions in the amount of \$50,000. Total reimbursement to the COUNTY for traffic mitigation measures under this agreement will not exceed \$50,000. Billings, or a billing, shall be directed by the COUNTY to the attention of Keegan Dole, Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Southeast Region, 141 NW Barstow Street, P.O. Box 798, Waukesha, WI 53187-0798 and will include a statement of expenses supported by a description of items and services to be provided and expended. The Department shall pay the bill (or billings, as the case may be) promptly upon receipt thereof.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Department entered into an agreement to provide special detail law enforcement services for a private event, the Los Pinos Event, held in the Town of Brighton, WI on May 27, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the Brighton Township permitted the event, requiring the host to have Sheriff's Department on the property to ensure safety and security, and

WHEREAS, the promoter of the event, Olmar Calzada of Salem, WI, has agreed to reimburse the Sheriff's Department for the labor costs incurred for assigning six Deputy Sheriff staff between the hours of 1200 to 2100 hrs on Sunday, May 27, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the reimbursement rates will be the wage schedule established in the current Kenosha County Deputy Sheriff's Association labor contract including employer paid FICA and employer paid Protective Retirement expenses as it relates to the total wages per officer assigned.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors accept the 2018 adjustments to both Revenue and Expenditure budgets of the Sheriff's Department, totaling \$2,387.77, as detailed in the attached budget modification form, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Whereas, approximately 3 million Wisconsinites voted in the November 2016 presidential election out of almost 4.5 million eligible voters in Wisconsin; and

Whereas, with an estimated 3.5 million eligible registered voters in Wisconsin, roughly 500,000 registered voters did not vote in 2016 and about 1 million still are not registered; and

Whereas, the result of Automatic Voter Registration (AVR) laws has increased voting percentages, as more eligible voters were added to the rolls; and

Whereas, Oregon, the first state in the union to implement automatic voter registration, in 2016, registered 288,516 new voters for the first time, of which 186,050 were registered as a result of the AVR law and an additional 35,000 Oregon residents whose registration had lapsed were re-registered through AVR; and

Whereas, according to the Department of Transportation there are 4,161,331 Wisconsinites with drivers licenses but, as mentioned, only 3.5 million registered voters meaning that, even adjusting for residents who are not citizens or who are under the age of 18, there are a substantial number of eligible voters who would be automatically added to the voter rolls; and

Whereas, automatic voter registration has saved money for taxpayers by reducing the time and cost of paper registration, just as Wisconsin online registration has simplified the process and cut costs for those who have been able to take advantage of it; and

**Whereas**, Assembly Bill 609 on Automatic Voter Registration was already introduced on November 2, 2017, but was not put on the Assembly schedule for consideration;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors call on the Wisconsin State Legislature to reintroduce legislation to pass an automatic voter registration law in Wisconsin, which would allow the Department of Transportation to coordinate with the Wisconsin Elections Commission in order to maintain a reliable data base of voter information, automatically registering eligible voters unless they wished to opt out of the automatic registration system; and

**Be It Further Resolved**, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Representative Eric Genrich, Senator Dave Hansen, Kenosha County's legislative delegation, Wisconsin Assembly and Senate leadership, Governor Scott Walker, the Wisconsin Counties Association, and to all other Wisconsin




