WHEREAS the United States was founded by immigrants, many fleeing religious persecution, who enshrined freedom of religion as one of our nation's fundamental legal and ethical principles; and

WHEREAS, the history of Islam in the United States began even before its founding when African Muslims were enslaved and brought to the Americas, where they later helped in numerous ways to build this country, including sacrificing their lives on the line in every major war from the Revolutionary War onward; and

WHEREAS there are more than 3 million Muslims living in the United States today. Kenosha County has 114 faith congregations¹ with 62,000 people in affiliation² with those congregations including 1 mosque, all making invaluable contributions to our economy, our social and political life, and our culture; and

WHEREAS there has been an unprecedented backlash since 9/11 in the form of hate crimes and employment discrimination toward Arab and Muslim Americans and those perceived as Muslims; and

WHEREAS Arab and Muslim Americans, and those perceived as Muslims, are frequently the targets of abusive and discriminatory police practices sanctioned by the state including surveillance in their neighborhoods and places of worship; and

WHEREAS we are saddened and outraged at the recent escalation of hateful rhetoric against Muslims, those perceived to be Muslims, immigrants, and all people of color, and we are particularly concerned to see political figures and elected government officials leading this escalation and using it in order to gain power; and

WHEREAS in the face of extreme bigotry and violence, Muslim communities and their leaders are using the language and teachings of Islam to promote peace and justice and service, and their institutions are continuing to play an essential societal role providing charitable and humanitarian services to those in need; and

WHEREAS we, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors, as elected representatives of the people, have a special responsibility not to stay silent in the face of hate, violence and discrimination against any of our constituents or countrypersons:

Now therefore be it resolved, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors

- (1) Condemns all hateful speech and violent action directed at Muslims, those perceived to be Muslims, immigrants and people of color;
- (2) Categorically rejects political tactics that use fear to manipulate voters or to gain power or influence;
- (3) Commits to pursuing a policy agenda that affirms & uplifts civil and human rights, and ensures that those targeted on the basis of race, religion or immigration status can turn to government without fear of recrimination
- (4) Reaffirms the value of a pluralistic society, the beauty of a culture composed of multiple cultures, and the inalienable right of every person to live and practice their faith without fear.

WHEREAS: The University of Wisconsin-Parkside has served Kenosha County for close to a half century with accessible, affordable public higher education connecting Kenosha County with world-class resources of the University of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS: The University of Wisconsin-Parkside has a direct and indirect economic impact in Southeastern Wisconsin, including 500 employees, 4,600 students and 16,000 alumni actively engaged in the region's economy; and

WHEREAS: More than 600 students graduate from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside each year, and more than 60 percent stay in Southeastern Wisconsin, working, raising families, and being productive taxpaying citizens in Kenosha County; and

WHEREAS: University of Wisconsin-Parkside alumni say their degree has opened doors in their professional careers, and data shows that individuals with a bachelor's degree earn an additional \$1 million over their lifetime; and

WHEREAS: While the state of Wisconsin faces a demographic shift with an aging population and shrinking labor force, the infusion of highly educated graduates from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside into Southeastern Wisconsin's workforce is essential to the region's economy; and

WHEREAS: The University of Wisconsin-Parkside has experienced a substantial reduction in funding from the State of Wisconsin since 2010, and, when adjusted for inflation, the revenue coming to the UW System today from the State of Wisconsin is the lowest in the history of the UW System; and

WHEREAS: The UW System, through its 2020FWD strategic framework and the 2017-2019 biennial budget request will help more students succeed and graduate in a timely fashion by

reducing time-to-degree, expanding college credit options for high school students, adding more options to transfer college credits, engaging businesses to help create job opportunities after graduation, and responding to the needs of nontraditional students and working adults; and

WHEREAS: The UW System 2017-2019 biennial budget request includes capital funding to support required maintenance and infrastructure upgrades to the University of Wisconsin-Parkside Wyllie Hall; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Kenosha County Board of Supervisors supports the UW System 2020FWD strategic framework, and strongly encourages the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin State Legislature to invest in the future of our children, and in the future of our state by approving the UW System 2017-2019 biennial budget request which will have a direct and positive impact on the University of Wisconsin-Parkside and the vibrant economic region that is Southeastern Wisconsin; and

Failure to do so will result in the denial for the cabaret license application.
- (6) Upon your inspection of the premises, determine if the establishment meets all requirements under Kenosha County Ordinance #8.02. If modifications are required, it is the responsibility of the establishment to meet these requirements and to contact K.S.D. for a follow-up inspection.
- (7) Check for proper posting of liquor and bartender's licenses. Please include expiration dates in your report.
- (8) Check for any underage person(s) during your visit.
- (9) Upon your final inspection, indicate in your report whether or not you recommend the approval of the license application based on your observations.






