Chad then provided a current class "B" liquor license #2016/2017-006. The license was issued July 1, 2016 and was valid through June 30, 2017 for the tavern. The listed agent on the liquor license was Raymond N. Weis. The liquor license, cabaret license, and bartender's license were visibly displayed within a cabinet near the bar area.

I informed Chad that he was responsible for contacting a local building inspector for a building inspection. I informed Chad that the results of the inspection were to be forwarded to the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department (KSD) 2nd shift supervisor. Chad stated he did not know he had to have an inspection of the tavern done. Chad was informed that failure to complete the inspection, and submit the inspection to KSD 2nd shift supervision would result in denial of the cabaret license. Chad stated he understood.

I conducted a walkthrough of the tavern. There were two exits with a listed exit sign on the doors. The path to the doors were clear of any obstructions and there was ample room for people to walk through. The bar area for the tavern had ample room for patrons and was well lighted.
