to the grounds up front and checked into an ER.

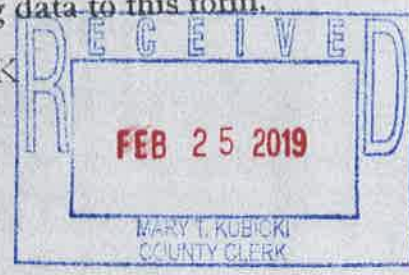
