WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department has partnered with Kenosha Joint Services, the Kenosha Police Department and the District Attorney's (DA) office to participate in a grant program offered through the WI Department of Justice (DOJ) to improve the sharing of arrest/complaint data between the agencies, and

WHEREAS, the grant is offered to prepare, build, test and implementent an interface between the law enforcement records management system, New World LERMS, and the DA's office PROTECT E-Referral software to share, electronically, arrest and complaint data to the DA's office which will eliminate the paper trail generated currently between the law enforcement agencies and the District Attorney's office and the double entry of the data prepared by law enforcement and entered manually in the DA's office PROTECT software, and

WHEREAS, this interface will improve efficiencies in sharing arrest/complaint data generated by the law enforcement agencies electronically to the District Attorney's office which will provide better accountability of documents, distribution of documents to the Courts and defense counsel and reduce data entry errors, and

WHEREAS, the state grant award covers the period through March 31, 2019, and

WHEREAS, certain staff identified, as the build team, from the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department, Kenosha Joint Services and the Kenosha Police Department will dedicate hours worked to prepare and develop and test the interface along with the New World LERMS vendor, Tyler Technologies, and these labor hours will be applied to the local match requirement for the project, and

WHEREAS, the grant funded amount is \$19,200 to cover the development cost from Tyler Techonolgies for the custom interface between the records management software and the DA's PROTECT software, plus a 10% local match requirement of \$2,134 which represents the personnel costs of the KSD personnel involved in the project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors accept the grant and approve that the revenue and expenditure budgets modified for the 2019 Budget year, as per the attached budget modification form, which is incorporated herein by reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any unobligated grant funds remaining available at year end 2019 be hereby authorized for carryover to 2020 until such time as the approved grant funds are expended in accordance with grant requirements, and that the Administration shall be authorized to modify the grant fund appropriation among various budget and expenditure appropriation units within the Sheriff's Department budget in accordance with all Federal and State regulations of the program and in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles.

- 3. Budget changes in excess of 10% of the approved line item amount and any increases for personnel compensation not included in the approved budget require approval from DOJ. All changes to the contractual category require prior DOJ approval.
- 4. Subgrantees acknowledge that failure to submit an acceptable Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (if required to submit one pursuant to 28 CFR 42.302) that is approved by the Federal Office of Civil Rights, is a violation of its Certified Assurances and may result in the suspension of the grant.
- 5. Grant funds will be paid to the grantee on a reimbursement basis.
- 6. Any changes in personnel involved with the grant including the project director, financial officer and/or signatory needs to be reported in a modification to DOJ via Egrants.
- 7. Fees for independent consultants may not exceed the federal rate of \$650 per eight-hour day, unless prior approval is received from DOJ.
- 8. All income generated as a direct result of an agency funded project shall be deemed program income. Program income must be used for the purpose and under the conditions applicable to the award. Program income should be used as earned and expended as soon as possible. If the cost is allowable under the Federal grant program, then the cost would be allowable using program income. All program income must be reported to DOJ.
- 9. Reimbursement for travel (i.e. mileage, meals, and lodging) is limited to state rates.
- 10. Recipient fully understands that DOJ has the right to suspend or terminate grant funds to any recipient that fails to conform to the requirements (special/general conditions and general operating policies) or that fails to comply with the terms and conditions of its grant award.
- 11. The Wisconsin Department of Justice reserves the right to withhold grant payments if the grant recipient is delinquent paying any obligation to the Department of Justice such as background check fees, etc.

12. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and to any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.
