Whereas, on June 10, 1919, Wisconsin was the first state to ratify the 19th Amendment, granting women the right to vote; and

Whereas, June 10, 2019, is the 100th anniversary of Wisconsin making history by becoming the first state to ratify the 19th Amendment; and

Whereas, Wisconsin women fought for the right to vote for more than a century — well before Wisconsin became a state; and

Whereas, the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution passed overwhelmingly in the Wisconsin State Senate 25 to 1 and in the Wisconsin Sate Assembly 54 to 2; and

Whereas, when the necessary 36 states ratified the 19th Amendment, half of the U.S. population was finally enfranchised on August 26, 1920; and

Whereas, daughters, granddaughters, and great-granddaughters of the women who fought for suffrage have been had their voices heard at the polls for nearly 100 years;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors, that Kenosha County celebrates June 10, 2019, as the 100th Anniversary of Wisconsin ratifying the 19th Amendment granting national suffrage to women.
