## ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Kubicki welcomed county employees, department heads, and taxpayers in attendance at the meeting. He asked while going through the budget process for the board to keep things on a civil playing field. He reminded the board we are at the local level, not the federal level. He acknowledged in attendance Youth In Governance Member Daniel Kuruvilla, Administration/Finance Committee and former member Dustin Beth. He stated that in July, the board adopted an advisory levy resolution not to exceed 2.5%. The County Executive introduced a responsible budget within that guideline. Although not everyone will agree with everything in the budget, he will continue having an open door to anyone who wishes to speak of their concerns. He thanked the board for all the work done to review the proposed budget. He thanked the Administration, Finance Director Dave Geersten and Budget Director Al Swartz and the entire Finance team for all the work they do to prepare our budget and answer all the board members questions.

Chairman Kubicki stated that he also is in favor of the overall 2015 Budget Resolution and intends on voting for passage of the resolution but he is aware that there could be a perceived conflict. So he will abstain from voting on any amendments related to benefits for current employees.

64. From Finance/Administration, Public Works/Facilities, Human Services Committees and Brookside Trustees regarding an Initial Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Not to Exceed \$18,550,000 General Obligation Bonds or Notes for Brookside Care Center Improvements.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the County Board of Supervisors of Kenosha County, Wisconsin (the "**County**"), that under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the County shall issue its negotiable, general obligation bonds or notes, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$18,550,000 for Brookside Care Center improvements, including, but not limited to, site acquisition and preparation, the construction and equipping of a new two-story, 48-bed rehabilitation center and a new 24-bed community based residential facility, and the renovation and furnishing of existing residential, common, and administrative areas; *provided, however,* that said bonds or notes shall be sold and issued in whole or in part from time to time in such amount or amounts as shall be within the limits provided by law.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the County Board of Supervisors of Kenosha County, Wisconsin (the "**County**"), that under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 67.12(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes, the County shall issue its negotiable, general obligation promissory notes, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$7,630,000 for budgeted capital projects, including road and highway improvements, and grants as described in the County's capital improvement budget, including but not limited to, technology upgrades, the purchase of trucks and equipment in multiple County departments, improvements to parks and County buildings, construction of and improvements to County roads, highways, bridges, paths, and related transportation infrastructure, acquisition of land, property, and right-of-way, and grants to nonprofit organizations; *provided, however*, that said notes shall be sold and issued in whole or in part from time to time in such amount or amounts as shall be within the limits provided by law.
