President's Comments	Dr. Gerlach stated that hospitalizations and clinic visits are going down. Concern that there is a new variant in Europe (Denmark) like Omicron. (00:00:22 – 00:01:15)	
New Food Code – Mark Melotik	Updating Chapter 16 Ordinance which regulates Food and Recreational Facilities. Hasn't been updated for the past 4 years as were waiting on code changes at the state level. The Environmental section regulates 1,000 facilities for food and recreation. Biggest change was taking "restaurant" out of the food code. They are now called retail food establishments that serve a meal. Grocery stores are included in this. Soup kitchens are exempt. The language in our ordinance needs to match our Administrative Code. Benefits to removing the word "restaurant" are now restaurants can wholesale up to 25% of their sales. Previously they needed a special license to do so. This also allowed us to clean up the language, show more transparency, and point the public to our website. Our fee schedules for all programs and applications have been posted on our website and can be printed off. Religious group/nonprofits are allowed 12 free days per year serving non-meal items, i.e., bake sale, ice cream social, and 3 free days in selling a meal i.e., annual church festivals. Regulating Air B&B's – looking at getting these licensed. Have 150 active rental units with only 35 licensed. "Swimlee" is a group that can rent back yard swimming pools. Per the state, we are not regulating this. If you have any questions, please contact Mark Melotik. This Ordinance will go to the Human Services Committee for approval on March 1, 2022.
