KEY STEPS TO BRONZE



- » Hire a Bicycle & Pedestrian Coordinator.
- » Increase education and outreach efforts. Work with local stakeholders to implement programs such as Safe Routes to School, and offer bicycle skill classes for adults. Take advantage of existing programs such as the Share and Be Aware program offered by WisDOT and the Bicycle Federation of Wisconsin.
- » Adopt a Complete Streets policy as recommended in the Comprehensive Bike Plan. Work with local jurisdictions to ensure that bike accommodations are included on their projects. This will serve to increase local connectivity to the facilities identified in the Plan.
- Continue to increase connectivity between various existing and proposed facilities. Incorporate both on-road and off-road

facilities as appropriate.

- » Adopt an ordinance that requires bike parking for new developments to secure private funding.
- » Expand encouragement efforts during Bike Month in partnership with local bicycle advocacy groups. Host, sponsor and encourage more bicycle-themed community events, campaigns and programs. Increase your efforts on Bike to Work Day and Bike to School Day.
