WHEREAS, the inhaling of vapor ("vaping") has been suggested as being a safer and more socially acceptable substitute to the practice of smoking, which requires the burning of a tobacco product; and

WHEREAS, recent occurrences, including over 2,000 cases of illness and 39 deaths as of November 2019 that have attributed to vaping have caused many to seriously doubt that suggestion; and

WHEREAS, there has been insufficient study to determine the potential harmful effects of secondhand vaping; and

WHEREAS, there is an obligation and duty on governments to protect the health and wellbeing of the population; and

WHEREAS, the longstanding understanding of the harmful effects of secondhand smoke led to the Wisconsin State Legislature enacting a general prohibition against smoking in indoor locations, contained in Section 101.123 of the Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, 2019 Assembly Bill (AB) 491 and 2019 Senate Bill (SB) 442 are currently pending in the Wisconsin State Legislature which would add vaping to that general prohibition;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors calls upon the Wisconsin State Legislature to pass 2019 AB 491 and 2019 SB 442 or legislation that is substantially similar; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors further calls upon Governor Tony Evers to sign that legislation when it is presented to him; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this resolution to the members of the Kenosha delegation to the State Legislature, to the office of Governor Evers, and to the Wisconsin Counties Association.

**WHEREAS**, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors on August, 17, 2017 passed a resolution calling for nonpartisan legislative and congressional redistricting maps; and

WHERAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 3 of the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Legislature is directed to redistrict state legislative districts "according to the number of inhabitants" at its next session following the decennial federal census. The legislature also reapportions U. S. congressional districts at the same interval pursuant to federal law; and

**WHEREAS**, recent polls indicate that as many as 72% of Wisconsin voters are concerned about the practice of partisan redistricting by whichever party holds the majority, because it may stifle political participation and competition, discourage collaboration and compromise, and lack the fairness necessary to our democratic process, by undermining the principle of one person one vote.

**WHEREAS**, the current procedure allows the legislature of the majority party to prepare redistricting plans and maps that may result in unfair partisan representation, allowing the legislature to choose its voters rather than the voters choosing their representatives, which is commonly called gerrymandering.

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Supreme Court has refused to rule on several high profile state gerrymandering cases, including one in Wisconsin and, as a result, has left this issue to be determined by state legislatures and courts.

**WHEREAS**, 50 Wisconsin counties have passed resolutions in support of nonpartisan redistricting, including 8 counties that have also passed county wide referendums.
