



WHEREAS, the 117th US Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill, and President Biden signed this act into law on March 11, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County has been identified as being apportioned approximately \$32.935 million in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County has received the first tranche of funds in the amount of \$16.468m; and

WHEREAS, the second tranche will be available after twelve months following the date of the receipt of the first tranche; and

WHEREAS, these American Rescue Plan funds are allowed to be expended from March 3, 2021 to December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the on May 18, 2021 the County Board of Supervisors directed the Administration to develop a plan to expend this funding, and bring this plan and any related budget modification to the County Board of Supervisors for approval; and

WHEREAS, in May, 2021, Treasury released the Interim Final Rule (IFR); and

WHEREAS, in September, 2021, Treasury announced that the Interim Final Rule is the governing rule until the Final Rule is released; and

WHEREAS, the Interim Final Rule has identified four broad categories in which ARPA funds can be expended; and

WHEREAS, those four broad areas identified in the IFR include:

- Responding to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19 or its negative economic impacts;
- Responding to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency;
- For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue;
- Making necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure;

WHEREAS, Kenosha County has identified expenditures in each of the areas defined by the IFR; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County staff are essential workers and have spent many hours performing essential work during the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Brookside Care Center has experienced additional expenses and a decline in census due to restrictions during the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County has unserved and underserved homes and businesses needing access to broadband; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County experienced significant revenue loss in 2020 due to the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue includes infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Plan was presented to the Finance & Administration Committee on October 14, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Plan has identified proposed expenditures for 2021; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors approve the allocation of ARPA funds for the 2021 expenditures as shown in the attached budget modifications and authorize Administration to process journal entries and transfers as needed to properly account for the use of these funds;

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) is making \$25.5 billion in new funding available for health care providers affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS, this funding includes \$8.5 billion in American Rescue Plan (ARP) resources for providers who serve rural Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) or Medicare patients, and an additional \$17 billion for Provider Relief Fund (PRF) Phase 4 for a broad range of providers who can document revenue loss and expenses associated with the pandemic.

WHEREAS, this funding will be distributed with an eye towards equity, to ensure providers who serve the most vulnerable communities will receive the support needed. These payments will be based on providers' lost revenues and expenditures between July 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021. Smaller providers who tend to operate on thin margins and serve vulnerable or isolated communities will be reimbursed at a higher rate than larger providers.

WHEREAS, bonus payments will also be made to providers who serve Medicaid, CHIP and Medicare patients who tend to be lower income and have more complex medical needs. HRSA will price the bonus payments at the generally higher Medicare rates for Medicaid and CHIP patients to ensure equity for those serving low-income children, pregnant women, people with disabilities and seniors.

WHEREAS to streamline the application process and minimize the administrative burdens, providers will apply for both programs (the \$17 billion PRF Phase 4 General Distribution and the \$8.5 billion ARP Rural Distribution) in a single application. HRSA will use existing Medicaid, CHIP and Medicare claims to calculate payments.

WHEREAS the application portal opens on September 29, 2021 and all health care providers should be able to apply for funding in this distribution. Providers will need to provide supporting documentation including internally generated financial statements that substantiate operating revenues and expenses from patient care during the relevant time periods.

WHEREAS, Brookside Care Center is a health care provider that can document revenue loss and expenses associated with the Covid-19 pandemic and Brookside Care Center is entitled to seek reimbursement through this application process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Brookside Care Center is authorized to submit an application and provide supporting documentation needed to apply for funds from the \$17 billion PRF Phase 4 General Distribution and the \$8.5 billion ARP Rural Distribution Funds to reimburse Brookside Care Center for revenue losses and expenses associated with the Covid-19 pandemic; and

BE IF FURTHER REVOLVED that Brookside Care Center is authorized to accept any grant funds awarded, process any budget modification related to that award and report back to the Human Services Committee and Finance and Administration Committee the amount of the grant funds received; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Brookside Care Center by Lynda Bogdala or her authorized representative is authorized to sign all documents needed to apply for this grant or to meet the intent of this resolution.

WHEREAS, the misuse of and addiction to opioids—including prescription pain relievers, heroin, and synthetic opioids such as fentanyl—is a serious national crisis that affects public health as well as social and economic welfare; and

WHEREAS, the opioid crisis is a public health crisis having devastating consequences including increases in opioid misuse and related overdoses, as well as the rising incidence of neonatal abstinence syndrome due to opioid use and misuse during pregnancy. The increase in injection drug use has also contributed to the spread of infectious diseases including HIV and hepatitis C; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, the number of opioid related hospitalizations in Kenosha County rose 60%; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, the number of all toxicity deaths in Kenosha County rose 63%; with 77% of all Kenosha County toxicity deaths being opioid related; and


WHEREAS, in an effort to continue to address the substance abuse issues in Kenosha County, the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has awarded Kenosha County Public Health a four-year grant: and

WHEREAS, the SAMHSA grant will allow for expanded NARCAN training, provide education, stigma reduction, peer support, treatment resources along with referrals for services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED based on the aforementioned, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors hereby approve Kenosha County Public Health's acceptance and spending of The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's four-year (09/30/2021-09/30/2025) FR-CARA grant # 1H79TI084560-01.

Business Done with Kenosha County Government in the past 5 years:

As Head of Development for Janko Group, I have been leading the company's efforts to secure entitlements, TID approvals, and utilities, and then develop the 170-acre Bristol Business Park, which is generally located at the NWC of CTH Q and CTH U in the Village of Bristol. We financed and began the construction of the park in fall 2020, and a year later are now completing the park's site and offsite infrastructure, as well as two industrial warehouse/distribution buildings totaling 700,000 square feet.

Part of the park's development is the improvement of the adjacent Kenosha County highways, CTH Q and CTH U. Over the past three years, I have been working with the Kenosha County Department of Public Works in designing and getting those improvements ready for construction. Kenosha County staff most involved have been Clement Abongwa, County Highway Commissioner, Ray Arbet, Public Works Director, and Jim Kupfer, Public Works CFO.

Last fall, the Kenosha Board of Supervisors approved the CTH Q/ CTH U roadway improvement project which includes right-of-way acquisition and extensive highway improvements. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was executed by Kenosha County, the Village of Bristol, and Bristol Land, LLC (Janko's entity that is developing Bristol Business Park) to govern the design, construction, and funding of the roadway improvement project. While it is 100% a Kenosha County project, all design, ROW acquisition and construction costs are being funded by Bristol Land, LLC.

Pursuant to the MOU, Bristol Land, LLC has provided required funds to the County for its use in the implementing the roadway improvements project. Since spring 2021, the County has been in the process of acquiring needed right-of-way. The County recently bid and awarded the contract for the roadway improvements. The first phase of construction is now slated to start in the second week of October, with final completion scheduled for summer 2022.





- 15. On September 10, 2021, the Kenosha County Redistricting Committee recommended to the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors to adopt a proposed tentative Kenosha County Supervisory District Plan as "Resolution No. 54." Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a true and correct copy of Resolution No. 54 as Exhibit A.

- 16. On September 15, 2021, prior to the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors considering the recommendation of the Redistricting Committee, Counsel, on behalf of his clients, served notice to Kenosha County of the illegality of the Adopted Map. Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a true and correct copy of the notice as **Exhibit B**.
- On September 15, 2021, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors, by a split 17. vote of 12 to 6, approved Resolution No. 54 and adopted the proposed tentative Kenosha County Supervisory District Plan. Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a true and correct copy of the Kenosha County Supervisory District Plan (the "Adopted Map") as Exhibit C.
- The overall relative deviation of population in the Adopted Map is 12.16%. 18. Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a true and correct copy of the "Adopted Deviation Spreadsheet" as Exhibit D.
- Pursuant to state and federal redistricting law, new Kenosha County supervisory 19. districts must:
 - Be substantially equal in population; (a)
 - Be compact; (b)
 - Be contiguous; (c)
 - Maintain communities of interest within a district; (d)
 - Comply with the Voting Rights Act; (e)
 - Preserve political subdivisions; (f)
 - Preserve cores of districts; and (g)
 - Preserve incumbents. (h)
 - The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map are not substantially equal in 20.

population.

- 21. The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map are not compact.
- 22. The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map are not contiguous.
- 23. The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map do not maintain communities of interest within a district.
- 24. Upon information and belief, the same which needs further discovery during the pendency of this litigation, the supervisory districts in the Adopted Map do not comply with the Voting Rights Act.
 - 25. The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map split political subdivisions.
- 26. The supervisory districts in the Adopted Map are vastly different than the current Kenosha County supervisory districts adopted in 2011.
 - 27. The Adopted Map is contrary to federal and state law.
- 28. Kenosha County is bound by the "one-person, one-vote" rule established by the U.S. Supreme Court.
 - 29. A maximum deviation above 10% is presumptively impermissible and illegal.¹

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION Declaratory Action

30. The Plaintiff incorporates by reference all paragraphs of this complaint as if fully set forth at length.

^{1 1. &}quot;Where the maximum population deviation between the largest and smallest district is less than 10%, the Court has held, a state or local legislative map presumptively complies with the one-person, one-vote rule. Maximum deviations above 10% are presumptively impermissible." *Evenwel v. Abbott*, 577 U.S. 937, 136 S. Ct. 1120, 1124, 194 L. Ed. 2d 291 (2016) (citations omitted).

- A controversy exists between the Plaintiffs and the Defendant as to whether the 31. Adopted Map is legal and constitutional.
 - 32. Should the Adopted Map remain, the Plaintiffs will be harmed.
- The actions by the Defendant presents a bona fide dispute between the parties 33. which requires declaratory relief determining the legality of the Adopted Map.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION Injunction

- The Plaintiff incorporates by reference all paragraphs of this complaint as if fully 34. set forth at length.
- 35. The Defendant has forwarded the Adopted Map to the City of Kenosha and various Villages and Towns for the purpose of drawing ward boundary lines.
 - The various municipalities rely on the Adopted Map to create wards. 36.
- Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.10(3)(b)2., within 60 days after every municipality in 37. Kenosha County adjusts its wards, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors is required to conduct a second public hearing after which it adopts a final supervisory district plan and numbers each supervisory district.
- 38. The Plaintiffs, should Kenosha County continue its acts in finalizing the Adopted Map, will suffer irreparable harm.
- 39. The Plaintiffs do not have an adequate remedy at law in that the harm caused will disenfranchise them and deprive them of constitutional rights.
- 40. The Plaintiffs have a reasonable likelihood of success on the merits, especially in light of the standard set forth in Evenwel v. Abbott, supra, which states that deviations above 10% are presumptively impermissible.

DEMAND FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs request judgment against the Defendant for:

- A. An order declaring that the Adopted Map is illegal;
- An order vacating the Adopted Map; B.
- An order enjoining Kenosha County from proceeding to finalize the Adopted C. Map.
 - For all costs, disbursements and actual attorney's fees, as allowed by law; and D.
- Such other and further relief, legal and equitable, general or special, to which the E. Plaintiff may be entitled.

WHEREAS, Art. I, Sec. 2 of the United States Constitution and federal law call for a decennial census to be taken and used as the basis for reapportioning or determining the number of representatives each state has in the House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS, each decennial census is used to redistrict or change district boundary lines for representatives at other state and local levels of government, including district boundary lines for state representatives, county board supervisors, and city aldermen so as to comply with the United States Supreme Court mandate of "one person, one vote" as set forth in the case of Reynolds v. Sims, 377 U.S. 533 (1964); and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes 59.10 (3) (b) requires that each county in the State of Wisconsin complete a tentative district boundary map for county board supervisors after receipt of official census map figures and further that such tentative plan then be sent to the various municipalities within the county for the purpose of determining ward boundary lines with each district; and

WHEREAS, due to delays by the U.S Census Bureau in providing that information, the process for conducting local redistricting has had to be accelerated in order to ensure that final maps can be approved as an ordinance with sufficient time to be properly noticed for the Spring 2022 elections; and

WHEREAS, Kenosha County is following the timeline proposed by the Wisconsin Counties Association in consultation with their municipal partners at the Wisconsin League of Municipalities and the Wisconsin Towns Association, which will ensure that the Spring 2022 elections can be properly noticed and conducted in districts which properly reflect the census data; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Census Bureau 2020 figures and data were received by Kenosha County on August 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, upon the receipt of such U.S. Census Bureau 2021 figures and data, the Kenosha County Office of Land Information utilized approved software (Wisconsin Shape Editor for Local Redistricting [WISELR]) to draw tentative plan proposals based upon the size of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, open meetings on redistricting were held on August 25, August 31, September 7, and September 10, as well as a public hearing on September 15, 2021; and

EXHIBIT "A"

WHEREAS, upon receiving public input on proposed plans, a tentative plan (Exhibit 1) was approved by the Redistricting Committee and was recommended by that committee to the County Board for approval; and

WHEREAS, the proposed tentative plan follows federal and state standards and guidelines in determining district boundaries, to wit: substantially equal population, compactness, community of interests within a district, compliance with the Voting Rights Act, preservation of political subdivisions, preservations of cores of prior districts and incumbents; and

Dear Chairman O'Day:

Please be advised that the undersigned represents several electors of Kenosha County and Kenosha County Supervisors in the referenced matter. I write specifically to demand that you cease and desist the illegal consideration of Item I. 54 on the agenda for the meeting scheduled for this evening. The proposed map recommended by the Redistricting Committee is unconstitutional and therefore illegal.

As you know, Item I. 54 on tonight's agenda is to consider the approval of a redistricting map to be forwarded to the City of Kenosha and various Villages and Towns for the purpose of drawing ward boundary lines. The proposed map flies in the face of the law and ignores nearly every constitutional principal for redistricting. The map MUST follow federal and state standards and guidelines to determine new district guidelines. Specifically, each district must contain substantially equal population, be compact, maintain communities of interest, comply with the Voting Rights Act, preserve political subdivisions, if possible, and preserve the cores of prior districts and incumbents.

Here, the overall deviation of population exceeds 12% - way past constitutional standards and completely unacceptable. This map blows past other constitutional standards as well. For example, White Caps Subdivision, clearly a community of interest, will be represented by THREE different supervisors if this map passes. That completely defies logic. White Caps has a single Homeowners Association with ONE alderman. This splitting of community will add to confusion and disenfranchises electors. Contiguity is also a concern with this map. The Town of Somers will be a part of the City of Kenosha under an intergovernmental agreement. This map creates islands in districts to "maintain" the Town of Somers. Currently, the City of Kenosha maintains the roads (e.g. snow removal) and picks up garbage for many properties in the Town of Somers. Soon, the Town of Somers will be no more and therefore should not be considered a "community of interest" for purposes of redistricting. The islands of the Town reflect much more closely with their neighbors in the City of Kenosha than any other municipality – especially when one considers that the Town will cease to exist in short order and will be completely enveloped by the City.



The acquired parcel was intended for the (Kenosha County) highway Project. However it, (the acquired parcel), was also used to cut a hole in the creek bank (lower the berm), and to run a sloping trench to the low point in the remainder land. Since this depreciates the remainder land, I want to contest the compensation award as they should have bought the larger parcel in its entirety. I believe the difference between the county's appraisal and the One Source appraisal is the DNR rules. Due to the "Acquisition of Land and Improvements for county trunk Highway S Improvement Project", parcel 30, I was sent a copy of "The Rights of Landowners Under Wisconsin Eminent Domain Law", describing the process under sec. 32.05 to contest the award. I believe the copy sent is a direct result of chap 32.26-6.

Kenosha County wrote the check for the compensation award.
