

- WHEREAS, Kenosha County acquired title to property formerly owned by John Prill that is located at 307 Hwy. Z. (parcel in the Village of Twin Lakes, Wisconsin through a tax deed issued on August 26, 2019; and
- WHEREAS, Kenosha County served a 28 Day Notice To Vacate Premises on the occupant of the property on August 30, 2019 and initiated eviction proceedings on November 8, 2019; and
- WHEREAS, John Prill has objected to the issuance of a tax deed against his property stating that there was a delinquent tax payment made in May, 2019 in the amount of \$6,000 and that he did not understand that he needed to pay an additional approximately \$1,000 to avoid a tax deed; and
- WHEREAS, John Prill came to the Clerk's Office at the end of August, 2019 to pay an additional amount toward his delinquent taxes and was beyond the date of transfer of the property by tax deed to Kenosha County and therefore he could not tender the amount to avoid the tax deed because he was several days late; and
- WHEREAS, The eviction proceedings against John Prill have not yet been concluded, with the result that John Prill continues to reside at the property; and
- WHEREAS, John Prill will suffer a financial loss from the taking of his property pursuant to the tax deed.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors pursuant to Kenosha County Ordinance 3.635 authorizes the conveyance of the property located at 307 Hwy. Z, Twin Lakes, Wisconsin to John Prill by quit claim deed upon payment of the delinquent taxes, interest, penalties and costs incurred by the County in connection with the acquisition and disposal of the property; and

Resolution Re: authorization for transfer of tax deeded land by quit claim deed to John Prill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk, the County Treasurer, the Corporation Counsel, and such other county employees and officials as may be necessary are directed to take the steps necessary to convey the property to John Prill by quit claim deed.

WHEREAS, Kenosha County collects fees from real estate related document recordings in the Kenosha County Register of Deeds Office, and certain portions of those fees are forwarded to the State of Wisconsin Land Information Program for the purpose of redistribution to the counties of the State for land records modernization projects, and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Land Information Program has awarded Kenosha County a grant of \$40,000 from the program, and

WHEREAS, the Division of Land Information recognizes that the Kenosha County Department of Public Works has numerous mapping needs and desires to utilize this Wisconsin Land Information Program grant for the creation of public works related mapping applications, and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Land Council, a statutorily required county oversight committee for Wisconsin Land Information Program generated funds, has reviewed and approved the use of these funds for the purpose of developing public works related mapping applications, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Division of Land Information to act on its behalf and accept and utilize the grant from the Wisconsin Land Information Program in the amount of \$40,000 and amend the budget as per budget modification which is attached and incorporated by reference.

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors on August, 17, 2017 passed a resolution calling for nonpartisan legislative and congressional redistricting maps; and

WHERAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 3 of the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Legislature is directed to redistrict state legislative districts "according to the number of inhabitants" at its next session following the decennial federal census. The legislature also reapportions U. S. congressional districts at the same interval pursuant to federal law; and

WHEREAS, recent polls indicate that as many as 72% of Wisconsin voters are concerned about the practice of partisan redistricting by whichever party holds the majority, because it may stifle political participation and competition, discourage collaboration and compromise, and lack the fairness necessary to our democratic process, by undermining the principle of one person one vote.

WHEREAS, the current procedure allows the legislature of the majority party to prepare redistricting plans and maps that may result in unfair partisan representation, allowing the legislature to choose its voters rather than the voters choosing their representatives, which is commonly called gerrymandering.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Supreme Court has refused to rule on several high profile state gerrymandering cases, including one in Wisconsin and, as a result, has left this issue to be determined by state legislatures and courts.

WHEREAS, 50 Wisconsin counties have passed resolutions in support of nonpartisan redistricting, including 8 counties that have also passed county wide referendums.




