ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE CHAIRMAN

Chairman Gentz stated if anyone is interested in purchasing an 8X10 of the County Board group picture to contact the County Clerk. Regarding Joint Services; the Evaluation Committee has narrowed it down to two. He will keep the board posted.

SUPERVISOR REPORTS

Supervisor Hallmon stated Human Services Committee received an update on the Income Maintenance Division. Childless adults can now apply for Badger Care because of the Affordable Health Care Act. May 1, 2014, 4,558 people in the Walworth, Racine, Kenosha Partnership Consortium will lose their Badger Care Plus. Those people will be notified that they can apply through the Marketplace.

Supervisor Rose stated the County Executive asked him to announce that the Niagara Bottling Company of California will build in Kenosha County a 377,000 sq ft. facility. This is the largest private bottling water supplier in the United States. They intend to commence work this summer on a 56 million dollar project.

Supervisor Breunig stated they interviewed 22 youth for Youth In Governance. They will review them at their next meeting then pass the names to the new County Board Chairman.

Supervisor Molinaro stated he has had limited conversations with the County Executive and KABA regarding Niagara Bottling Company. This exactly what the high impact fund was engineered to do.

Policy Resolution - second reading, two required

POLICY RESOLUTION 3

3. From Finance/Administration Committee – Establishment of a Donations Policy.

WHEREAS, from time to time there is a desire on the part of individuals, groups, or units of government to gift, donate, or otherwise provide to Kenosha County non-monetary assets; and

WHEREAS, Recognizing that there are times where such donations, while appreciated, may have associated costs for which the current year's budget did not anticipate or account for; and

WHEREAS, the County Board, being proper stewards of the County's finances, wishes to ensure that such a well-intended gift does not result in significant adjustments of carefully planned and approved budgets;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors approves a policy that any donation of a non-monetary asset whose fair market value and any associated and non-budgeted costs exceeds \$50,000 must be approved by resolution of the County Board. This policy shall not apply to real estate and will not supersede any donation policy previously adopted by the County board, such as the one at Brookside; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs the County Executive and the administration to carry out the intent of this resolution and the implementation of this policy.
