WHEREAS, The Kenosha County Sheriff's Department, as the Agency in charge of the Kenosha County Sheriff's Bomb Squad, has been awarded \$19,129 from the State of Wisconsin through the Department of Military Affairs-Homeland Security/Bomb Squad to purchase a replacement X-Ray Device, and

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department Bomb Squad is a regional response team that responds to and processes Hazardous Device Incidents in Kenosha County and the Southeast Wisconsin Region, and

WHEREAS, the X-Ray Device will be used to examine suspicious packages that could be a potential hazard. This equipment is new generation X-Ray system that would replace our current 1st generation system. New X-Ray equipment will provide more accurate and faster images for our Bomb Technicians to read and determine a faster and safer way for a render safe procedure, and

WHEREAS, the awarding agency is not requiring a hard match for this award, therefore, no additional tax levy dollars are requested to implement this grant award, and

WHEREAS, the project funding period for this grant expires March 31, 2015...

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors accept this grant and approve the revenue and expenditure budget line modifications to the 2015 budget as per the budget modification form, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Note: This resolution requires NO funds from the general fund. It increases revenues by \$19,129.00 and increases expenditures by \$19,129.00.

RESOLUTION 84

84. From the Finance & Administration and Judiciary and Law Committees a Resolution WI DOT Kenosha County PreTrial Intensive Supervision Program XVIII Grant award for fiscal year 2014-2015.

WHEREAS, the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department has been awarded **\$75,000** by the WI Dept. of Transportation (DOT) to support expenditures for the "Kenosha County Sheriff's Department DUI Intensive Supervision Program" now in its 18th year, and

WHEREAS, the funding award period began July 1, 2014 and runs through June 30, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the total operating budget for the Kenosha County 2014-2015 Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) is \$158,099 funded by four sources:

- (1) State DOT grant \$75,000
- (2) Client Fees expect to be collected by Wisconsin Community Services, Inc. \$17,012
- (3) Sheriff's Dept. In-kind match of \$20,087 (Office space in the Public Safety Building for WCS Inc. and Sheriff Dept oversight labor costs)
- (4) Sheriff's Department hard match for the grant period -\$46,000; the hard match portion of this project had been approved in the 2014 and 2015 adopted budgets, and

WHEREAS, the 2014-2015 Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) will continue to be facilitated by the Wisconsin Community Services, Inc. (WCS) out of Milwaukee, WI for which a contract for services had been reviewed and approved by county Administration, and

WHEREAS, the program facilitates repeat DWI offenders to be screened by WCS, Inc. staff to receive intensive counseling treatment and supervision in lieu of pretrial incarceration in an effort to effectively deter repeat offenses and reduce jail time at sentencing, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kenosha County Board of Supervisors accept the awards from WI DOT **totaling \$75,000** and approve the Revenue and Expenditure line item modifications to the **Sheriff's 2014 budget** as per the attached budget modification form, which are incorporated herein by reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any unobligated WI DOT ISP grant funds remaining at year end 2014 be hereby authorized for carryover to 2015 budget year until such time as the grant funds are expended in accord with the WI Dept of Transp ISP grant requirements, and that the Administration be authorized to modify the grant appropriations among various budget and expenditure units within the Sheriff's Department in accordance with all federal and state regulations of the program and in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles.
