CITIZEN COMMENTS

Jack Rose, 4315 68th St. spoke regarding Resolution 15. National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) does not support prescribing psychologists, nor does Mental Health America. A better choice would be a nurse practitioner. They have a medical background and work closely with a medical doctor such as a psychiatrist. An alternative to a prescribing phycologist is an effort to pursue the pairing of a Nurse Practitioner with a Psychiatrist that way the Nurse Practitioner can prescribe medication. Also mentioned in Resolution 15 is the increase of cost at the Winnebago Mental Health Institute which has jumped dramatically. It is his opinion part of that cause has been St. Luke's Hospital cutting their psychiatric beds in half. They need and appreciate the boards support with the Human Services budget. Things are not going to get any easier, the need for mental health treatment is getting larger.

Barb DeBerge stated she is a member of CUSH and invited the members of the community along with law enforcement to a Community March for Peace and Healing on July 21st at 7pm down by the Museum. This event marks a starting point for CUSH to foster dialog and action that leads to equality, justice, peace and healing for our whole community.
