Announcements Of The Chairman

Chairman Esposito thanked the County Executive and the Administration for the budget they have brought forward. He thanked the County Board Supervisors, Department and Division Heads for all the hard work, long hours and time spent on this budget.

Supervisor Reports

Supervisor Elverman reported on the Public Works. Due to high water, Hwy W is closed between Hwy F and JI in the Town of Wheatland. Due to excessive water along the Fox River they have State and County workers doing soil borings to see what type of plan is needed to handle this issue. Paving of all the miles and contracted work with local municipalities has been completed. Some paving at the golf courses was not completed. Phase one of the Hwy S project is not on track. Bid packets were supposed to be out for circulation. Today the State has pushed it back until February. Hwy S Phase 2 is on schedule for April. Hwy F reconstruction is scheduled for March. Kenosha County Parks received the prestigious award, Wisconsin Park and Recreation Association Silver Star Award for creative service, delivery, marketing and their partnership with Boundless Adventures. Beirgarten at Petrifying Springs and Brighton Dale Golf Course are closed for the season. Everything will be moved to Pets. Golfers will be able to golf when the temperature is above 40 degrees. The new golf simulator is at Pets and they will have the end of year sale on the equipment. Anderson Arts Center is 90% complete. Kenosha County Center chiller replacement project has accepted a bid for \$253,000, to be completed by April 2020. P&D remodeling should be done in a couple weeks.

Supervisor Berg reported on the Human Services Committee. Guest speaker Ms. Donna Rhodes spoke about her position as a Gang Intervention Supervisor. She is also in charge of the Summer Youth Employment Program. She shared that 11 years ago they started with 1140 youth arrests. For the past 5 years it's been less than 400 arrests. This year they had 227 at-risk youth work 20 hours a week over the summer. Each one received a ½ credit through KUSD. There are 30 work sites that have partnered with this program. Located at the Job Center, the Summer Youth Arts Program created a "Can You Jump As Far As?" mural which includes a raccoon, chipmunk, grasshopper, squirrel and a fox.
