<b>Corporation Counsel's Report</b>	Working ongoing with the HUD Lead Program to make improvements on contracts for the program. (00:26:34)	
Health Officer/Director's Report  a. Disease Investigation & Contact Tracing b. Testing c. Vaccination d. Other Public Health Services	There are currently 2 Covid testing sites in Kenosha County: the Kenosha Community Health Center (KCHC) at the old Chase Bank downtown and UW Parkside. KCHC does about 250 tests per week and UW-Parkside does 100-125 rapid antigen test per day. Encouraging people to get tested so that we can track and trend this. Death rates are still too high with 1-2 deaths per day.  Our COVID website has been updated with more stats on vaccination and links to register for appointments There are 8 locations offering vaccines in Kenosha County. We focus on vaccinating those that live and work in Kenosha County. Currently vaccinating 65+ and 1a category (heath care, law enforcement, fire, and emergency management). March 1st sees the education and childcare sector. Projecting rest of the groups mid-March.  Press/Media coming out today on our new Call Center. For those with no internet/email, they can call us at 262-605-6799 to sign up for an appointment. Have been averaging 150 calls per day.  Currently receiving 2,000 1st time doses per week along with our 2nd does (mainly Moderna).  Have received much positive feedback on our clinics. The National Guard supplies workforce for our clinics along with volunteers from WEAVR (Wisconsin Emergency Assistance Volunteer Registry). Board of Health members are encouraged to volunteer through WEAVR.wi.org	

	We have detailed plans in place for mass clinics (broader community clinics) which are dependent on our supply of vaccine. We have met with our 11 districts and our childcare centers to discuss the March 1 gating opening for them. The Birth to 3 Program was opened last week for any parents or caregivers of a child who is in this program. Our clinics are open for anyone 65+ or in the 1a category who live and/or work in Kenosha County. We discourage nonresidents from attending our clinics.  Our two new Public Health Strategists have been hired. One solely working on Health Equity and the other is through the Narcan Grant and is co-chairing the broader Opioid Task Force.  Progressing forward with our new electronic medical record system.  Last Fall we started our Internal Three-Year Strategic Plan. Goal is to continue this Spring. We have chosen a new vision, mission, strategies and 2 goals over the next 3 years.  **Vision: An Equitable, Engaged, & Healthy Future**  Mission: To inspire health and wellness in Kenosha County through service and leadership Strategies: Using science, partnerships, and education for environmental, population, and clinical health  Goals: Build and strengthen community partnerships to enhance collective impact strategies; Incorporate health equity throughout all programs and services  Values: Communication, Teamwork, Accountability  Question on 2nd dose — a week before or week that a person is due for 2nd dose, they will be contacted by us via the method they signed up for their 1st dose (either email or phone) with a new link to schedule their 2nd dose appointment. This is a guaranteed spot. We discourage people coming to us for a 2nd dose if they didn't get their 1st dose with us. This causes inaccuracies with the vaccine count for us and them.  If any of you would like to tour our clinic, you are more than welcome. Our clinics typically run Tuesday — Friday from 9:00 a.m. — 3:00 p.m. and we do not bill for vaccine.
