SERVICE HIGHLIGHT:

CCS COORDINATION COMMITTEE AND CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS COMMITTEE

Many of Kenosha County's Medicaid funded programs host quarterly meetings to receive program feedback from participants and other stakeholders. In 2022, program meetings will be merging to streamline the feedback process and increase participant turn out.

Service Highlights:

The CCS Coordination
Committee is comprised of providers, advocates, participants and families.
Members are responsible for reviewing policies, procedures, and improvement plans, and making program recommendations. The Children with Special Needs Committee, which seeks feedback from stakeholders and participants of the Children's Community Options Program (CCOP) and

Coordinated Service Teams (CST) program, acts to develop and review program plans, identify gaps in service, and increase access to community resources. Many juvenile participants are dually enrolled in multiple programs making it difficult to attend multiple committee meetings. Since all committees rely on the input of program participants and community partners, the Children with Special Needs Committee will be merging with the CCS Coordination

Committee to streamline the feedback approach and improve turn out. Participants and families who are interested in sharing their feedback about CCS, CCOP or CST programing should be referred to their assigned service coordinator who can provide them committee meeting dates and information on how to become a committee member.
