Action and Advocacy – Liane Blanck	 Monthly Highlights Lori Plahmer welcomed our new Board of Health member, Juan Torres. Nearing completion of our Community Health Assessment Report. Submitted our 2022 Annual Report (posted on DHS and Health Department website). The Health Department and Aging & Disability submitted a grant for 2 vending machines that would house Narcan, Fentanyl test strips and medication lock bags. These would be placed West of the I at the Sharing Center and at the Crisis Center in Kenosha. Last week the clinic saw our first client at our new satellite clinic West of the I. Community Health Assessment (CHA) Review – Kim Whitmore Stacey Wians, Public Health Supervisor, oversees the Community Health Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan which are state requirements. Stacey introduced Kim Whitmore, Ujima United, LLC who we have contracted with for this work. 	
	Kim Whitmore, consultant has an extensive background in governmental public health. Kim presented a power point that provides an overview of the process. The Community Health Assessment (CHA) has been newly branded "Kenosha County Thrive".	

The committee felt it very important to create branding and identity around this initiative. The goal is to create a thriving and healthy community. Started with Community Health Assessment, then identifying priorities to put together a realistic plan moving forward which will become the Community Health Improvement Pan (CHIP) for the teams to work on over the next three years.

Kenosha has a diverse number of stake holders invested throughout the community. The group has intentionally engaged these partners throughout the process.

Strategies used were a Community Health Survey with almost 1,000 responses; 8 Community Conversations with 85 participants; and using data stories with multiple data sources to frame the report.

Highlighting different sections of the report:

Executive Summary, Community Health Assessment Overview, Who Took the Survey, Priority Issues, Review of Existing Data, Data Stories. Data visuals were displayed in a simple, easy- to-understand manner.

The top 3 issues in Kenosha County were: 1). Access to Healthcare, 2). Affordable housing, 3). Drug and Alcohol use. Racism and equity intersect with all key issues.

Question: At a community level how do we address access to health care?

Very large issue but there are evidence-based strategies and best practices to address this.

Identified priorities – where we can make the biggest impact? This is a community-wide initiative.

Forming action teams on May 17. Will have a Steering Committee, Co-leads for each action team, members serving on action teams.
