## Directions:

- From I-94, take HWY 50 west to CTH "KD" (14.5 miles)
- Turn left on CTH "KD" (352nd Ave.)  
Take it to CTH "F" (2.6 miles)
- Turn right on CTH "F" take it to the  
park entrance (.5 miles)
- The park entrance will be on the right  
side of CTH "F"

# PARK HISTORY

234 acres of a former gravel mine was acquired

- Paving 1/2-mile parkway
- 38 parking stalls constructed
- Storm water management features installed

30 acres of prairie restored on the western side of the park

- Development of new parkway honor plaza and expansion of multi-use and hiking trails
- 100+ oak trees transplanted to a 43-acre site in park

- Veterans work group created in 2020



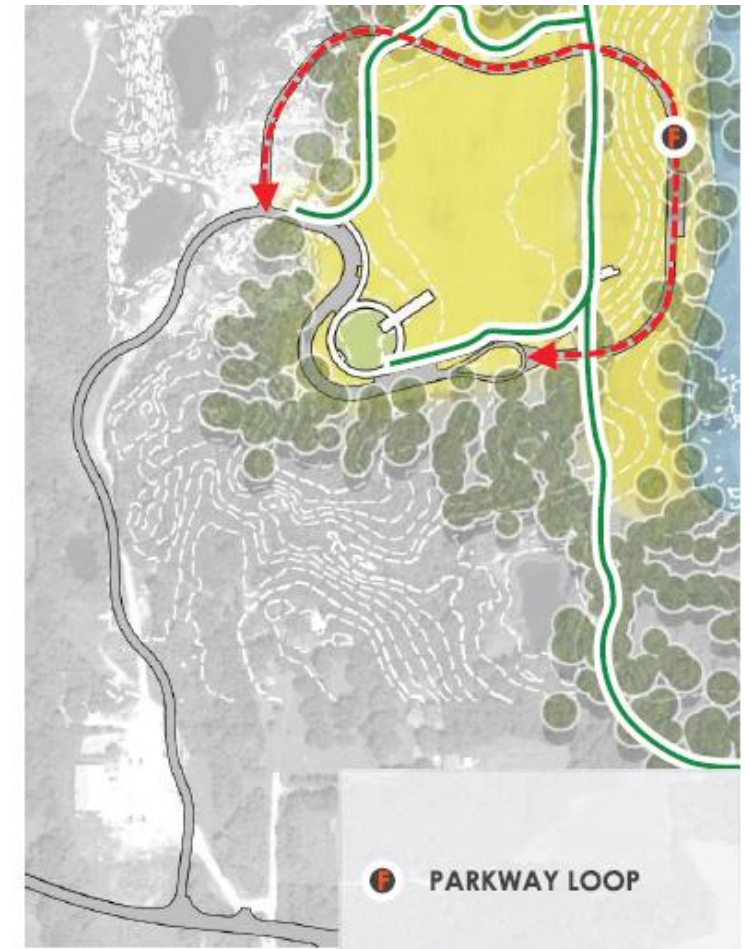
# VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK MASTER PLAN PHASING

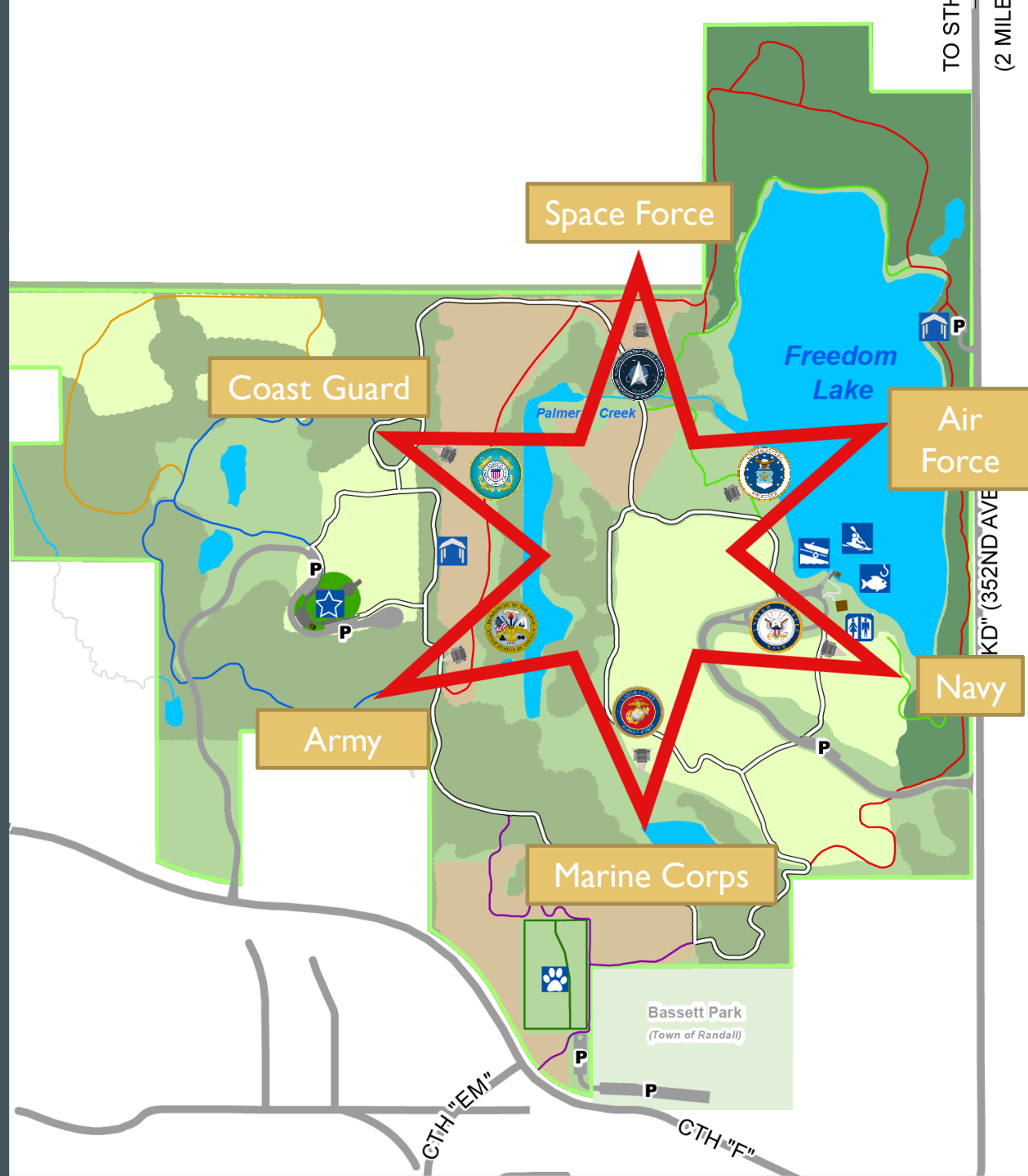

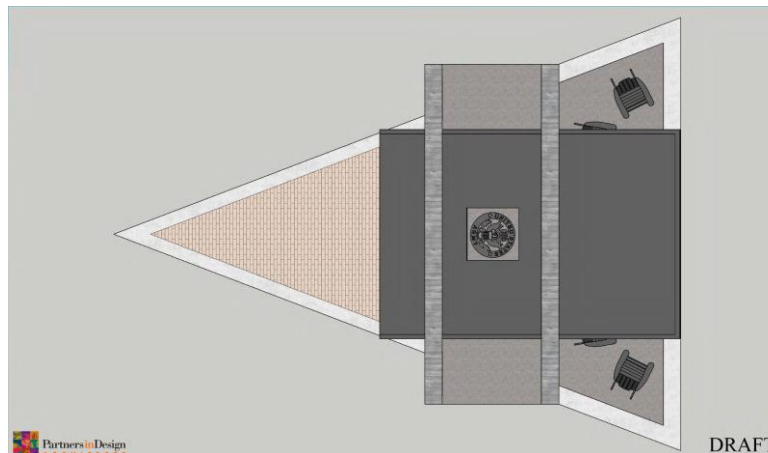
# MEMORIAL SHELTERS

- Memorial Shelters offer publicly accessible therapeutic retreats that will represent each military branch
- Each shelter is designed to symbolize the point of a star to passively embody the veteran's memorial theme within the park



# MEMORIAL SHELTERS

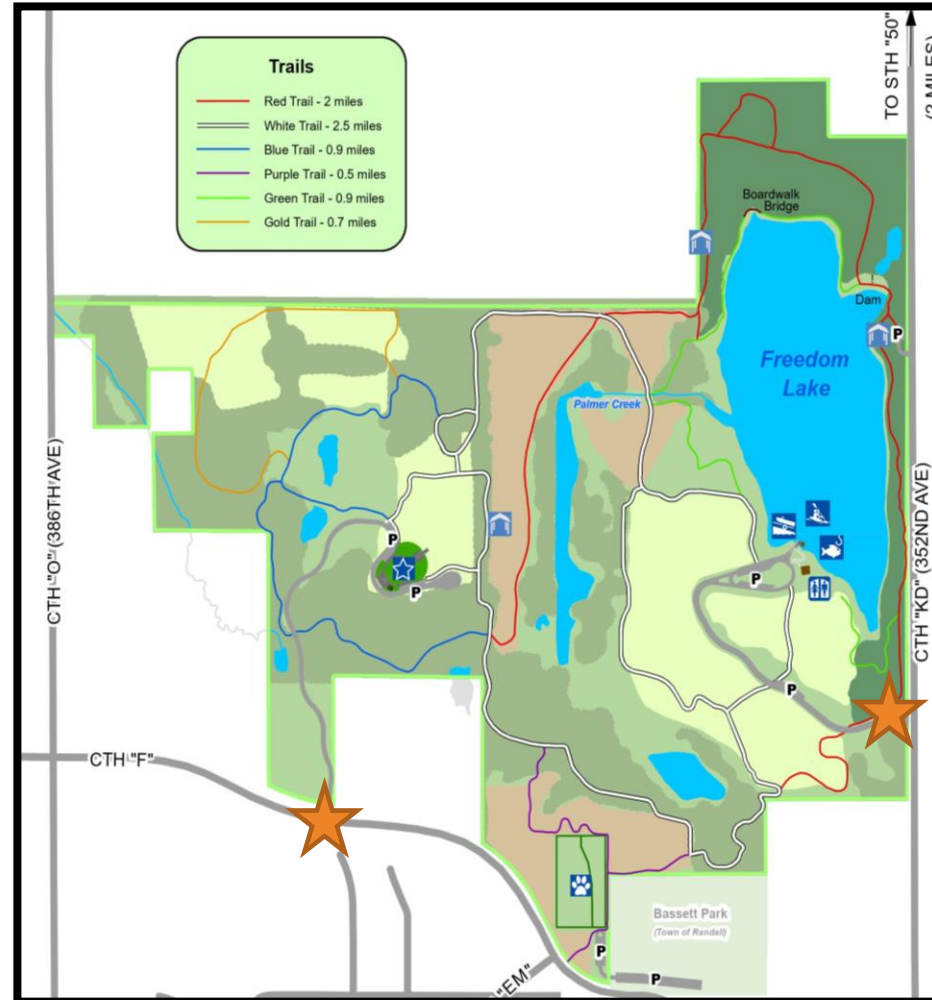
- Memorial Shelters include a corporate sponsor plaque as well as recognition on the donor wall within the Honor Plaza
- Veterans, families, and the public will also have the opportunity for memorial brick donations at each Memorial Shelter
- \$250,000 per Memorial Shelter

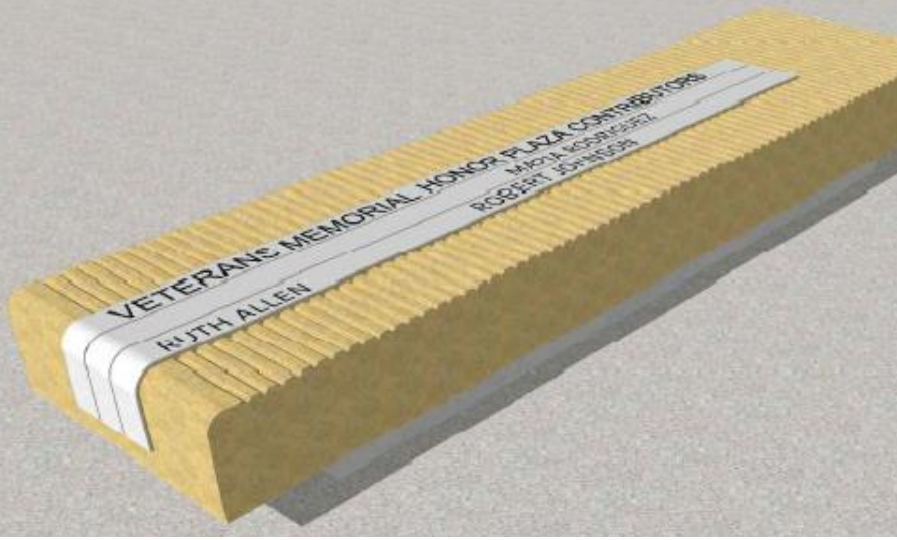




# FRONT ENTRANCE SIGNS

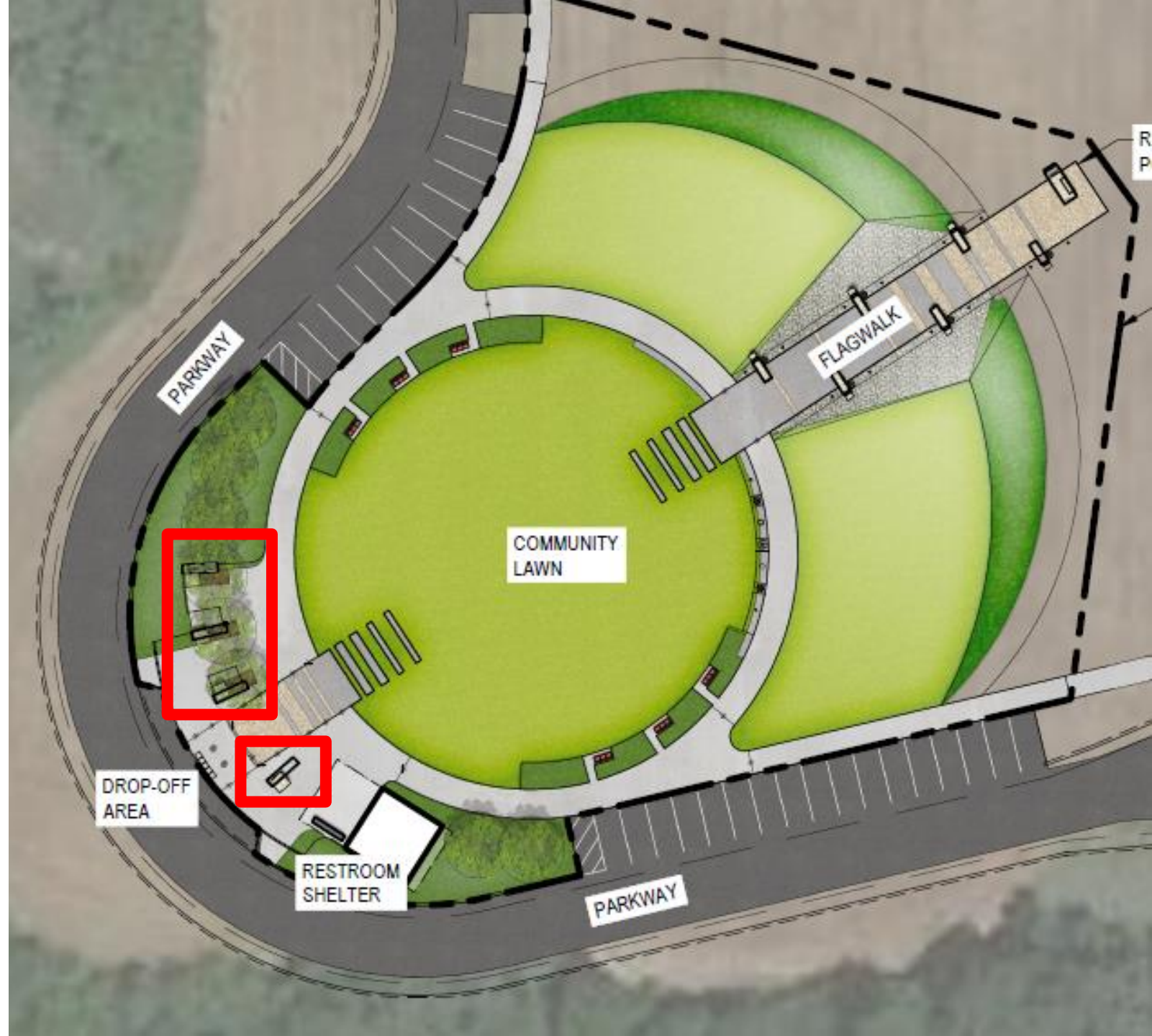
- 2 entrance signs locations

- \$11,250 per bench



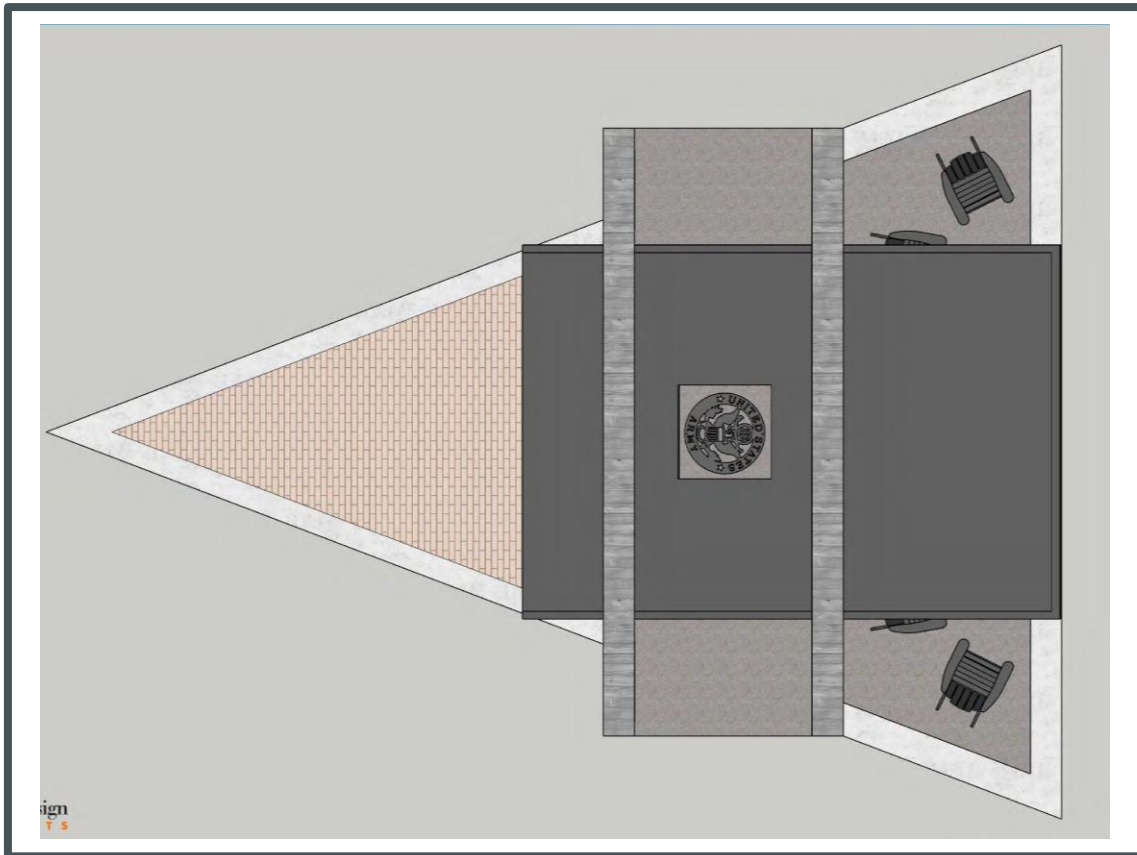


## PARK BENCHES

- \$2,900 per bench

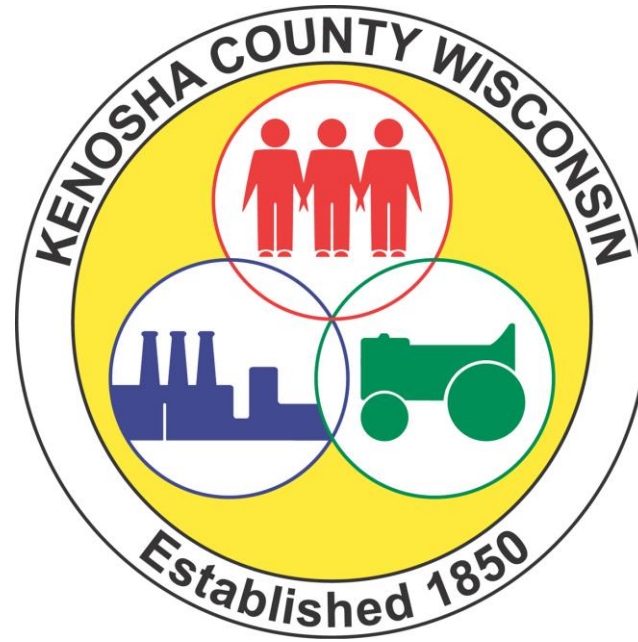


# MEMORIAL BRICKS

- \$100-\$250 per brick
