BE CAREFUL!

These products have warning labels on them for a reason. Before putting them in your car, take the following precautions:

Keep products in their original containers when possible.

Make sure products are properly sealed to prevent leaks and spills.

If a container is leaking, put it into a secondary leak-proof container.

Do not mix products together.

Dangerous reactions can occur when some chemicals are mixed.

Pack containers in sturdy boxes in the trunk of your vehicle, away from the driver, passengers and pets.

Cardboard boxes work well, but containers (other than gasoline cans) and boxes cannot be returned to you.

Please do not put items in plastic bags.

If a product does not have the original label, label it yourself if you are certain of the contents.

This will help us dispose of it properly.

Always store products in a secure place, away from children, pets, sparks and flames.

The Kenosha Municipal Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program Collection will be held one Saturday in the Spring.

If your Town or Village is in Kenosha County, you can drop your materials off at the Kenosha County Center located on Hwys. 50 & 45.

The Collection will be on Saturday May 4, 2013 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
