Low Income Eye Care Options

Eye Care America: Offer free eye exams through volunteer eye doctors, if you qualify. Eyeglasses are NOT covered. Must be legal US residents without an eye doctor and not have eye care insurance coverage.

People age 65 and older that have not seen an eye doctor in three or more years may be eligible for more a complete medical eye exam and ongoing eye care for a year.

People who are at high risk for glaucoma (by age, race, and family history) and have not had an eye exam in 12 months may be eligible for a free glaucoma eye exam if they don't have insurance. Call for details:

New Eyes for the Needy: Offer vouchers for eyeglasses but does not pay for eye exams. A voucher covers the cost of a basic pair of single or bifocal eyeglasses. You must be low income and have a recent eye exam and a prescription for glasses. Applications must be completed through an registered agency, you're doctor or school nurse. Society's Assets, Independent living Division is a registered agency to process these applications. ADRC staff can call SAI , for a consumer and make this formal referral, connecting them for further service. Call for details and application:
