
## When will my new tax key parcel numbers be assigned as a result of my recorded land division document?


The Kenosha County Land Information Office is responsible for creating the new active parcel numbers in the land information database reflected on the public Property Inquiry website. When a land division takes place, the existing parent parcel number is made inactive and set to expire at the end of the calendar year during which it was subdivided. New parcel numbers are typically issued 2-3 weeks after the land division document is recorded with the Register of Deeds. If you recently recorded a land division document and need to know what new tax key parcel number(s) will be assigned to the child properties, the quickest way to become aware of the new tax key parcel number assignments is by monitoring the parcel number of the parcel being subdivided on the Kenosha County Property Inquiry website. This database is updated nightly, so checking the database once a day will suffice.

Begin by navigating to the Kenosha County Property Inquiry located at the web address shown below:






Search for the existing parent parcel number (tax key identification number) that is being subdivided.



When the parcel number is marked as a "Historical Parcel" you will know it has been split. You will see the child parcel numbers in the legal description section.





You can then click "Reset Search" and search for the new child parcel numbers.
