Kenosha County, especially LakeView Corporate Park in Pleasant Prairie, has drawn business from Illinois for decades. 

Kenosha County is fiscally strong

- 2014 General fund reserves are expected to exceed \$12.6 million (unaudited) the highest in the history of the County. We expect to exceed 22% of general fund expense, exceeding the 17% policy by 5%.
- 2014 Sales tax is estimated to be \$12.7 million, the highest in the history of the County.








State Budget Impact

Budget Analysis

- Transportation
 - The Governor follows through on his commitment to fully fund the 4 percent increase for general transportation aids approved in the 2013-15 budget.
 - Repeals the requirement that DOT must construct bicycle and pedestrian facilities on new highway construction.
 - Prohibits DOT from funding community sensitive design on state highway projects. This prohibition would not prevent local governments from funding community sensitive design costs if they choose to do so.
 - However, we are very concerned about the funding mechanism for transportation needs within the State Budget. The 1.3 billion in borrowing is not a substantive long-term solution for the looming shortfall in the Transportation Fund.









State Budget Impact

Budget Analysis

- Property Tax Assessment
 - Proposal to change the property tax assessment process from municipality-based system to a county-based system with an opt-out for the ~18 1st & 2nd class cities.
 - Changes begin in 2016 and are completed by 2017.
 - The maximum annual amount a municipality could be charged is 95%
 of what a municipality previously paid for assessment services in 2015.
 - DOR would maintain oversight of the property assessment system.



State Budget Impact

- Overall Analysis
 - The 2015-2017 State Budget contains several items that will impact counties – Aging and Disability Services, courts and highway maintenance
 - Kenosha County will advocate against the reinstatement of county-wide assessment with your assistance
 - We look forward to working with Chairman Kubicki, Vice-Chairwoman Breunig, all of the County Board committee chairs and supervisor, as well as the Wisconsin Counties Association, and Wisconsin Legislature as we continue through the budget process to offer ideas, input and solutions.
