State and Federal Impacts





INSURAR Elimination of the Municipal Property Insurance Company, resulting in at least a \$45,000 increase next year.



A \$400,000 increase cost for foster care/ based on a State-required assessment screening tool.



Hopefully, delayed for a year is a state requirement to increase information on the tax bills, which our Treasurer Teri Jacobson estimates will be a cost of more than \$200,000 annually in 2017.



A freeze on Medical Examiner fees and passing along the full cost of indigent burials to the counties.



A \$48,000 loss in revenue that had funded an intoxicated driver program.



Total = More than three-quarters of a million dollars.

Wildcard State and Federal Issues: Costs Unknown

State-approved drug testing for income maintenance recipients, if approved by the federal government

Returning 17 year-old firsttime nonviolent offenders to the juvenile justice system, if approved





Mental Health: County and Community Challenges

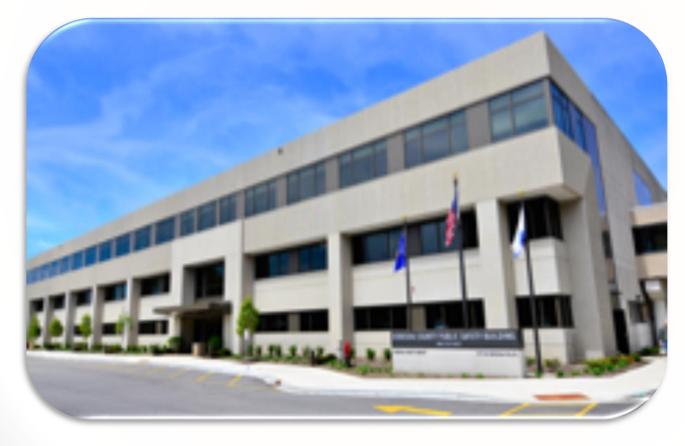
